- ❑ Albert Einstein Memorial [Constitution Avenue and 22nd Street, Washington, D.C.]. Engraved on the memorial are Albert Einstein’s words: “As long as I have any choice in the matter, I shall live only in a country where civil liberty, tolerance, and equality of all citizens before the law prevail.” Albert Einstein became an American citizen in 1940, and made his home in Princeton, NJ.
- ❑ Synchronize your watch to Official U.S. Time [Web site: www.time.gov]. Official U.S. Time is calculated from atomic clocks at the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) and the U.S. Naval Observatory (USNO).
- ❑ Synchronize your watch to Coordinated Universal Time (UTC), also called Official World Time [Web site: www.boulder.nist.gov/timefreq]. Listen to UTC announcements on a shortwave radio: The radio station, WWV, broadcasts UTC announcements, geophysical alerts, marine storm warnings, and Global Positioning System (GPS) status reports twenty-four hours a day. The frequencies are: 2.5, 5, 10, 15, and 20 MHz. Book: *Passport to World Band Radio*, by Lawrence Magne [0914941852, NF, MS+].
- ❑ Look up at the night sky—it is filled with the light of other days! Because it takes one second for light to travel 186,000 miles, when you look at the moon, you are looking 1.3 seconds into the past; when you look at Saturn, you are looking 75 minutes into the past; when you look at Pluto, you are looking 4 hours into the past; when you look at the Andromeda galaxy, you are looking more than 2 million years into the past.

- ❑ Kennedy Space Center [Cape Canaveral, FL, 321-449-4444, www.kennedyspacecenter.com]. Watch a rocket launch, board a full-scale replica of Space Shuttle *Explorer*, have lunch with an astronaut, and sign up for the Astronaut Training Experience. At Launch Pad 34, the site of the 1967 Apollo 1 fire, a memorial plaque reads: “In memory of those who made the ultimate sacrifice so others could reach for the stars. Ad astra per aspera [a rough road leads to the stars]. God speed to the crew of Apollo 1.”
- ❑ Space Center Houston [Houston, TX, 281-244-2100, www.spacecenter.org]. Tour Mission Control, try on space helmets, and take a simulated walk on the moon.
- ❑ U.S. Space & Rocket Center [Huntsville, AL, 800-533-7281, www.spacecamp.com]. Sign up for Space Camp; Go on a simulated space shuttle mission!
- ❑ National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) [Washington, D.C., www.nasa.gov].
- ❑ Memorials to Apollo 1 astronauts Gus Grissom and Roger Chaffee, and the crews of Space Shuttle *Challenger* and Space Shuttle *Columbia*, are located in Arlington National Cemetery [Arlington, VA, 703-607-8000, www.arlingtoncemetery.org]. The memorial to Apollo 1 astronaut Edward White is in the United States Military Academy Post Cemetery [West Point, NY, 845-938-4011, www.usma.edu]. There are three hills on the planet Mars dedicated to the crew of Apollo 1: Grissom Hill, White Hill, and Chaffee Hill.
- ❑ Explore the exciting world of model rocketry [Estes Model Rocket Company, www.estesrockets.com].

- ❑ The Very Large Array is the world’s largest astronomical radio observatory, consisting of twenty-seven 230-ton, 82-foot diameter radio antennas [Socorro, NM, 505-835-7243, www.vla.nrao.edu]. The data from the antennas is combined electronically to give the resolution of an antenna 22 miles across, with the sensitivity of a dish 422 feet in diameter. Movies: *2010* [1984, PG] and *Contact* [1997, PG].
- ❑ Hayden Planetarium [Rose Center for Earth and Space, New York, NY, 212-769-5100, www.amnh.org]. One of the world’s best planetariums.

- ❑ Authentic NASA mission patches are sold at The Space Store [Houston, TX, 877-742-2311, www.thespacestore.com]. Authentic replica NASA spacesuits are sold at Space Toys [Show Low, AZ, 877-223-0070, www.spacetoys.com].
- ❑ You can’t visit the secret movie sound stage from which the fake Apollo 11 lunar landing was purportedly broadcast on TV, because it doesn’t exist; the United States really did put a man on the moon in 1969. Also, there is no “face” on Mars left behind by an ancient alien race; it’s just your imagination. Books: *Bad Astronomy*, by Philip Plait [0471409766, NF, MS+]; *Magnificent Mars*, by Ken Crowell [0743226011, NF, MS+]. - ❑ Robert Goddard Rocket Launching Site and National Historic Landmark [Pakachoag Golf Course, Auburn, MA, 508-755-3291, www.cr.nps.gov/nhl]. The spot where Robert Goddard launched the world’s first liquid-fueled rocket, on March 16, 1926, is located on the ninth fairway; the golf course used to be a farm. Movie: *Rocket Men* [1994, D, NR].
- ❑ NASA sent the Apollo 14 astronauts to Craters of the Moon National Monument [Arco, ID, 20 8-527-3257, www.nps.gov/crmo] to expose them to geologic conditions similar to what they would find on the moon. NASA also trained astronauts at the 4,000-foot diameter Meteor Crater in the desert southwest [Flagstaff, AZ, 800-289-5898, www.meteorcrater.com].
- ❑ RUS Adventures [Moscow, Russia, www.rusadventures.com] arranges tours of the historic sites of the Soviet space program. Strelka and Belka, the first dogs to survive orbital flight, are eternally preserved in a glass case in the Memorial Museum of Astronautics in Moscow. Strelka gave birth to six healthy puppies after her space flight in 1960. One puppy, named Pushinka, was given to Caroline Kennedy, the daughter of Jacqueline and President John F. Kennedy, as a present from Soviet Premier Nikita Krushchev.
- ❑ Astronauts of the Mercury and Gemini missions used pencils to take notes in space because standard ballpoint pens did not work in zero gravity. The Fisher Space Pen Company [Boulder City, NV, 702-293-3011, www.spacepen.com] solved the problem when it introduced the Fisher AG-7 Space Pen in 1966. Instead of relying on gravity to work, the pen used a pressurized cartridge of nitrogen that enabled it to write in freezing cold, desert heat, underwater, upside down, and in outer space. The Apollo 11 astronauts took the pen to the moon.
- ❑ SETI@home [http://setiathome.ssl.berkeley.edu] is a scientific experiment that uses Internet-connected computers in the ongoing search for extraterrestrial intelligence. You can participate by running a free software program on your home computer that downloads and

analyzes radio telescope data. Perhaps you will be the first to hear the words: “Klaatu barada nikto!”
